



Arizona Community College Workforce Scholarship Program Fact Sheet

Governor Hobbs and Arizona's 10 public community college districts are partnering together to create the Arizona Community College Workforce Scholarship program. The scholarship will help Arizonans earn a credential, degree or build advanced skills that lead to jobs in high-wage, high-growth occupations.

Meeting the Needs of the State's Economy with Postsecondary Education

This scholarship is aimed at fostering a skilled workforce tailored to the evolving demands of our state's economy. The scholarship will incentivize Arizona students to pursue higher education and earn a credential, license or degree, moving the state closer to reaching its Achieve60AZ education attainment goal.

Governor Hobbs has allocated \$4.5M in EANS federal funding to kick start the scholarship, with the goal of the program continuing in the future with public or private funding.

Scholarships for Arizonans

The Community College Workforce Scholarship program is projected to serve 9,000-10,000 Arizona students, including working adults, who are looking to upskill and reskill. The program will support students in the upcoming summer and fall semesters.

A Focus on High-Wage, High-Growth Industries

The scholarship will focus on the following high-wage, high-growth sectors for this scholarship program. Each community college will focus on the regional industries present in their communities:

- Advanced manufacturing, including semiconductors
- Health Care
- IT/cyber security/broadband/data analytics
- Education and early education
- Construction/trades/HVAC
- Aerospace/defense
- Veterinary technology
- Dental hygienists and dental assistants
- Tractor trailer driving
- Insurance appraisers

- Paralegal and legal assistants

Workforce Scholarship Eligibility

Students participating in the Workforce Scholarship program are required to meet the following criteria:

- Have a 2.0 GPA or better.
- Meet with their academic advisor to review their academic plan and progress.
- Be eligible for in-state status for tuition purposes as defined by Arizona Law and the College
- Be enrolled in or enroll in, a degree, certificate or credential program in one or more of the above high growth/high wage program areas.
